CINCINNATI, OH – May 28, 2019 - The Cincinnati Community ToolBank announces today that they will be offering free tools and equipment to all nonprofits, churches, schools, and neighborhood organizations assisting with relief and clean-up efforts in wake of the recent tornados that have effected Dayton, Ohio.
